Applicants can be unsuccessful for a number of reasons and should be aware that some programmes at the college may receive more applications than the number of places available. Unsuccessful applicants will be notified of the reason for this decision. Unsuccessful applicants may wish to request feedback on the reason for the outcome of their application. All requests for feedback must be made in writing to the Director (Quality & Learner Experience) and signed by the applicant.

Where the admission of an applicant could place learners and/or staff at risk, e.g. where the applicant has a history of violence or any other form of abuse towards others.
